Keep Felines Safe During the Cat Days of Summer

Warm weather and summer fun can also signal potential risk to your feline. Keep kitty safe with these tips for the "cat days" of summer.

Keep kitty well hydrated.

- Get your cat to drink more by swapping out cute little ceramic water bowls for much larger dog bowls. Some cats hate having their whiskers touch the sides of the bowl!
- Use ice cubes as summer toys to slide across floors and to get cats to lick extra water.



- Ask your vet to write down the right dose of Benadryl (Diphenhydramine Hydrochloride) and show you how to give it by mouth in case kitty is stung by a bee or wasp.
- If you see swelling on your cat's face, paws or body, contact your vet immediately. In most cases, cats have only minor discomfort that goes away quickly, but some cats can experience serious complications.
- Of course, keeping your cats indoors is the best way to prevent from insect bites!

Cats Need Mental and Physical Stimulation

Just like people, cats can become bored without mental and physical stimulation. Finding out HOW your cat plays can make all the difference. Try toys from each of the following categories to see which your cat responds to:

- Big chasing toys like balls or wheeled mice
- Small chasing toys like laser pointers
- Wrestling toys like large stuffed animals
- Dangling toys to bat

Get the most for your money by choosing the type of toy your cat most likes to play with made by a brand that uses high-quality,

Make Summer Road Travel with Kitty a Little Easier

For some cats, road travel can be very stressful, whether it's just a trip to the vet, a summer weekend or an extended vacation or business trip. In any case, make car travel less stressful for both you and your kitty by following these tips.

DO:

- Invest in a good quality hard-sided pet carrier with soft blankets and padded cushion for the bottom.
- Use Google Maps to plan out rest stops at least every four hours to let your cats out of the carriers (either in the car or on leashes).
- The night before you leave, give kitty dinner of canned food and extra water. The morning of the trip, just give a small snack and a little water to reduce the chance of car sickness.
- Spray Feliway (a product that mimics the natural feline facial pheromones that cats use to mark territory as safe and secure) around the car before putting cats in.

When Flying With Kitty

Talk to the airline to ask about their policies on approved carriers and bringing your cat through

Have your cat examined by your vet and ask for a health certificate showing recent vaccinations to bring on the plane.

DON'T

NEVER give kitty sedatives. They have many side effects and can cause complications.

Staying at Home Can Be Safer & More Comfortable for Kitty

If you decide that your kitty's better off left at home while you travel, NEVER leave your pet unattended for more than two days.

Before you leave:

- Unplug all electronic devices
- Loop cords of curtains and blinds out of kitty's reach.
- Arrange for someone to stop by, even if you are gone just a day or two, to make sure kitty is okay and to provide some interaction and companionship.



If you will be gone for two days or more, arrange for a pet sitter who stays in your home or comes by daily to feed and interact with your cat. Another option is to board your cat at a reputable boarding facility or veterinary hospital.

Make an unannounced visit to the boarding facility you are considering. Check for:

- - Areas for cats to play and stretch
- · Relative quiet and peaceful surroundings
- Experienced kennel staff ask to meet them!

Whether you have a kitty sitter or are boarding your cat, ALWAYS leave contact information for yourself and for someone you trust who will be in town in case you are not reachable.

Breed profile: Ragamuffin



Ragamuffins are described as "ideal" for first-time cat owners due to their relaxed and warm dispositions. They are family-oriented and quickly bond with children and other pets.

Ragamuffins do not make good outdoor cats because they are slow to defend themselves and even in intense play, rarely put out their claws.

Ragamuffins have long, plush coats in a variety of colors and patterns. Their

silky coats can get matted if left un-groomed, but they are otherwise low-maintenance and generally healthy with regular veterinary visits.
