

March is National Kidney Month

Help Keep your Cat's Kidneys Healthy

This month, during National Kidney Month, is a good time to remind cat families about the importance of healthy kidneys. Kidney disease is one of the leading causes of death for cats. What can you do to make sure your cat has healthy kidneys?



Canned-food- only diets (and no dry food at all!) are the gold standard for cats. These foods have more moisture to help keep the kidneys flushed out and the body hydrated.

2. Encourage cats to drink more water.

Offer fresh water daily at multiple water stations throughout the house.

3. Get a screening blood and urine panel annually.

This is important for cats of all ages in order to catch kidney changes early. The earlier the diagnosis, the easier it is to treat and manage kidney disease with better results.

New Lost & Found Map Makes it Easier to Find Lost Pets



Michigan Partnership for Animal Welfare (MPAW) has created a new lost and found map on its website for lost pets. Pet families can go to http://michiganpaw.org/lost-and-found-pet-map/ to locate animal shelters in their area that hold pets for state-mandated stray holding periods. The mandate requires shelters to hold strays without identification for a minimum

of 4 days, and 7 days for animals with ID (tag, microchip or tattoo). The idea is to give concerned pet owners a place to start looking for their pet once they've gone missing.

A Cat's Not Just a Cat!

Breed Profile: American Curl



In 1981, a stray black kitten with unusual ears was found on a doorstep. The affectionate kitten quickly endeared herself to the family and was named Shulamith. All American Curls trace their heritage back to her. Geneticists have confirmed that the ear-curling gene Shulamith carried is unique. A cat with even one copy of the gene will show the curled-ear trait.

American Curls are curious, exuberant and loving companions who greet each day with joy as they look for new adventures. They are exceedingly people-oriented and are known to pat their caregivers to get attention and include them in their activities.

American Curls come in longhair and shorthair with a myriad of colors. While the curled ears are the major feature of this special breed, other characteristics are its large walnut shaped eyes and medium-sized rectangular body.

Cat's Meow Tip: Medication Station Simplifies Treating Diabetic Cat

"Do you have a diabetic cat? Then you have syringes, lancets, cotton balls, glucometer tester, test strips and treats among the stuff needed for a twice-a-day routine. I suggest setting up a "medication station." This is a dedicated place that includes a compartmentalized tray for keeping everything organized and at hand. I have my medication station up in an upper kitchen cabinet, directly above the counter that Newton and I use twice a day for our routine."
