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#### September is Pain Awareness Month

## **Cats Left in Pain Often Experience Other Health Problems**

Pain Awareness Month, started by the American Chronic Pain Association, raises awareness of the debilitating effects of untreated pain and pain management in humans.

Similarly no cat – or other pet – should ever be in pain. There are many feline-safe medications that treat short-term and chronic pain. Uncontrolled pain is a major stressor and affects physical health including wound healing and resistance to disease. Animals whose pain is prevented or controlled recover faster and better from surgery.

**NEVER** give human pain medications to pets. Some can be fatal.

Sudden pain, such as that experienced during surgery, if not managed properly, can lead to pain that can last for months or longer. Cats who have had surgery without proper pain management will be frightened and stressed during future veterinary visits. Can you imagine having surgery and going home without pain medication? Or having a painful disease, such as cancer or arthritis, and not taking anything for pain? Our feline friends deserve to have their pain treated, just like we do!



#### Types of Feline Pain and How to Tell if Your Cat is Hurting

Cats can experience pain for a number of reasons. Here are some of the most common:

Injury/trauma: Any injury will be painful and require pain relief.

**Surgical**: Even routine surgeries, such as spay / neuter, declaw and dental procedures with extractions cause considerable pain.

**Neuropathic:** Cats can experience damage to body tissue and nerves causing constant. Pain results from even light touch to the affected area.

**Chronic disease:** Pancreatitis, arthritis, dental disease, interstitial cystitis and cancer are probably the most painful, though other diseases such as kidney disease can make cats constantly nauseous.

#### Signs That Your Kitty May be in Pain:

- Change in eating habits / loss of appetite
- Hiding / withdrawal from humans
- Sensitive to touch; hiss/growl when touched
- Licking / biting themselves
- Not using the litter box
- Sitting on top of paws sphinx-like
- Lack of grooming
- Reluctance to jump

### Keep Back Packs & School Lunch Boxes Out of Kitty's Reach

Every fall, the Animal Poison Control Center sees an increase in backpack-related pet poisonings. Back packs can contain any number of toxic substances; at the top of the list are human medications. Also, some lunch box foods can be highly toxic to pets. Watch out for the following:

#### Backpacks:

- Gum (can contain xylitol which is highly toxic to pets)
- ADHD medication (often amphetamines)
- Albuterol inhalers used for asthma
- Over-the-counter medications (especially non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (such as aspirin, Celebrex, Motrin and others), as well as Tylenol

Grapes

Raisins

• Onions

• Macadamia nuts

Old /moldy foods

**IMPORTANT:** NEVER leave a pet in a

costume alone; some pets may chew

and swallow parts of the costume.

#### **Choose Feline-Friendly Halloween Costumes**

If you are thinking about a Halloween costume for your kitty, before you decide, put safety first. Make sure your cat is safe this Halloween by choosing costumes that **DO NOT**:

- Impair vision, movement or breathing.
- Contain metallic beads, snaps or other small pieces that can be swallowed.
- Have tight elastic that can choke or restrict kitty.
- Include application of dye or coloring to your pet's

fur. Even if the dye is labeled non-toxic to humans, it can still be harmful to pets.

Devon Rex cats trace their ancestry back to Kirlee, a feral cat with a curly coat, who lived in an abandoned tin mine in Devon, England.

Devon Rex cats are intelligent, mischievous and playful. They want to be involved in everything, are very people-oriented and get along well with children and other pets. However, do not leave your Devon Rex home alone for long periods as this breed can become destructive if they get bored.

Devon Rexes are muscular mid-sized cats. Their soft, short, curly coats vary from a tousled mop of curls to a thin suede-like coat.
